


## Game Changer 2023




## CFS Coaches and Staff: The Pillars of Our Success

# A word from our Executive Director

When I started in October I had no idea what I was getting into...As I think about the last 7 months, what stands out is the passion our staff and coaches have for youth development and teaching the game of chess.

The impact of their hard work and dedication really hit me at this year's State Tournament. I watched as a young student broke down at their chess board... they had just lost their first round match. They got up and walked off crying, but after taking a few steps, they turned around, walked back to their board, reached out their hand and said "well played." They helped reset the board before running away to fall into their father's arms. I watched as Dad provided comfort, support and praise and I moved away and gave them space. As we began round 2, I noticed the same player - still visibly upset - starting their next game. After a couple moves they broke down again and it hurt my heart. I didn't think they'd finish the game, but I circled the room and eventually worked my way back to them. In that time, this kid had rebounded and flipped the script. You could see the change... their confidence and joy... they went on to win the game and I caught the moment they ran into Dad's arms and saw the smiles on both faces.

The grit and perseverance this kid showed, the emotional control they demonstrated and the dad's reaction was my "aha moment." We impart so much more than Chess... we really do help these youth develop skills that will make them better people. When I stopped by to congratulate the player and their father I learned this was their first Chess Tournament. Through our program, this player has developed chess skills and better social and emotional skills. I also learned that dad had never been prouder of their kid than the moment they turned around and shook hands.

As we plan the 2023-2024 program year, I think about that moment at the tournament and I want to make sure every youth we work with develops both their chess skills and their social/emotional skills... that will be our focus this year. We are a unique organization and I feel blessed to be working with a dedicated and talented staff, strong community partners and funders. It takes a community to better the world and we are developing a really strong, open and accepting community.
